Zia Annual Meeting Minutes from January 18, 2024

The 2024 Annual Meeting of Zia Rifle and Pistol Club was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at Glory Christian Fellowship Church, with club President Pat Mileschosky presiding. A quorum of general membership was not achieved with 40 of 154 required Regular and Senior members present. A quorum of the BOD was achieved with 19/21 board members in attendance.

Item I Welcome, Introductions, Attendance, Agenda, and Minutes

The agenda for the Annual meeting was approved with one addition (Vic Echeverria: presentation).

Minutes from the December 2023 BOD meeting were approved without changes.

Item II - Treasurer's report

Sharon Foreman gave a report on the financial status of the Club and outlined all the accounting and procedural improvements made over the past year. Highlights include getting the Club's financial records into Quickbooks and making sure all expenses have adequate documentation. The Treasurer's report was approved and entered into the Club record.

Item III Annual Business

Since 10% of the voting membership was not present, election of the board will be by mail-in vote to be tallied in March.

Pat called the Special Meeting to order (see Minutes of the Special Meeting below)

Club dues will remain at 2023 levels (Regular \$145, Senior \$95, Associate \$25, Junior \$10)

The Annual Financial Audit Committee was appointed (Pat Mileschoky, Jay Sullivan, and Tom Tomasi)

Item IV - Old Business

Heidi Chowning gave an update on the Club website and the electronic membership system progress. She briefly described the expected renewal process. The Club expects to be ready in early February for online renewals.

Nate Eskey gave a brief overview of the anti-gun bills that have been pre-filed in Santa Fe. He reiterated the importance of the Club membership to call, email, and otherwise contact the lawmakers in opposition to these nonsense laws.

Pat provided a status update on the range property lease. We seem to have addressed all the State's requirements and will hopefully have a new lease soon.

Item V - New Business

Gary Wells polled the room to gauge interest in having open airgun matches on Wednesday evenings. Enough interest was indicated to proceed.

Vic Echeverria wanted to present an award to Ron Bjornberg, but Ron had to leave before this point in the meeting. Vic described Ron's service to the Club and to the Action Handgun Activity.

Item VI - Adjourn

After discussing all the items on the agenda, and there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:46 p.m. The next BOD meeting will be held on February 15, 2024 starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Bear Canyon Senior Center, 4656 Pitt NE.

Zia Member Spotlight *Vic Echeverria*



How long have you been a Zia member?

I've been a Zia member for somewhere in the neighborhood of 30 years.

What made you want to join a shooting club/Zia?

The primary reason was to give my boys a chance to be exposed to the shooting sports. One of the first things I did was get them participating in the Junior Rifle that was being done in the indoor range.

When did you start shooting?

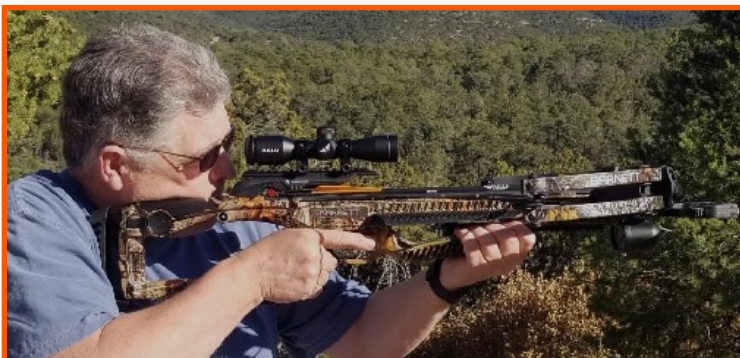
Like most men of a certain age, I've always had some interest in shooting growing up with those old westerns will do that. As I recall, my stepfather bought me a BB gun when I was about 8 years old; he'd take me out to shoot on the bayous around New Orleans. Over the years, I've had the chance to do some very casual shooting here and there. My sophomore year of high school I met my future in-laws and, since they were long-time participants in the shooting sports, I had a chance for a broader exposure and more opportunities to shoot. As my sons reached their mid-teens, we began to participate in more of the activities available at Zia.

What do you like the most about Zia?

First, is the facilities that enable a number of different shooting activities: shotgun, long-range rifle, action pistol berms. Second, is the number of organized activities that take place and make it easy to participate in a wide variety of shooting events.

Which activities do you participate in at Zia?

Over the years I participated in a number of activities at one time, I was shooting in six different activities a month. As the Activity Chair for Action Handgun, that is my primary focus. As a participant, I shoot Sporting Clays and



Wobble Trap. I've recently started shooting Smallbore Silhouette and .22 Steel again. In the past, I've also shot Lever-gun Silhouette and 3-Gun. The biggest problem for me is there aren't enough weekend days to remove scheduling conflicts and enable me to shoot all of those things every month.

Which of your guns do you like shooting most?

I can't say there is one strong contender for favorite firearm. The fact that Zia offers so many different activities means I don't have to choose, I can shoot many of guns on a regular basis. With Action Handgun, with often highlight different handguns (revolvers, .45, PPC, compacts, etc) and encourage folks to dig different things out of the safe for a little range time this is particularly true with our quarterly Carry Matches where we encourage folks to shoot those smaller firearms that they likely carry but perhaps don't shoot regularly enough.

What are your thoughts on things the club should do in the future?

I definitely want to see some of the newer initiatives the club has started over the last year or so be supported and continue on a regular basis. From the perspective of Action Handgun, one of the biggest of those is providing training opportunities such as Range Officer classes so that more folks can feel comfortable with those roles and more willing to actively help run our matches.

Who do you shoot with most?

Because there are two opportunities every month, I spend the most time with the Action Handgun and Shotgun folks. Because there are a few of us that indulge in those particular activities, I spent quite a bit of range time with Ron Bjornberg, Lyn Carter, and Javier Chavez. I also spend a good bit of range time with folks that are at virtually every Handgun match and are actively helping keep that activity moving: Bryan Maglidt and Chris Garrett, in particular.

What's something interesting about you that's completely unrelated to shooting?

I'm a computer geek that rides a motorcycle, earned a black belt in karate, and makes some pretty good Louisiana meals (crawfish etouffee, red beans & rice)

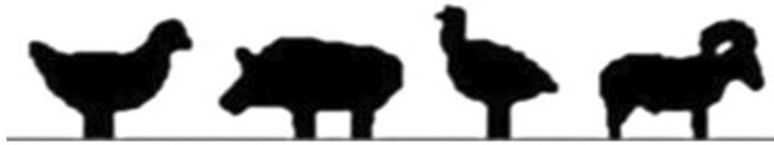

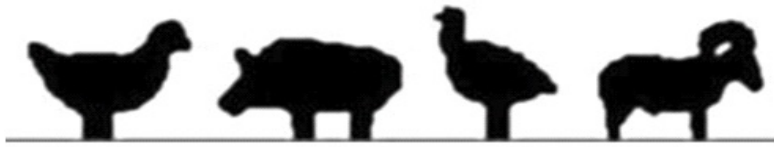

At the previous Small Bore Rifle Silhouette match held on February 4th that had a record number of participants (33 shooters), it was determined that some improvements were necessary and long overdue. A plan was made, a work crew assembled, and off we went. 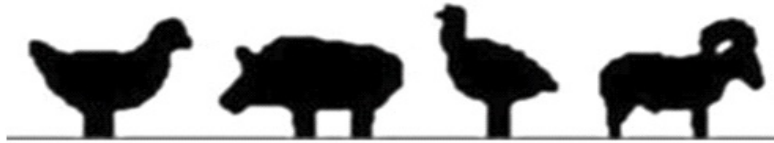
Small Bore Rifle Silhouette Match February 4, 2024

Small Bore Silhouette shooting is one of the most challenging sports for individual marksmanship. Many great shooting competitions offer challenging shots at long range from a bench or other supported position. All our shooting is done from a standing position swaying in whatever breeze there happens to be. We shoot 10 chickens at 40 meters, 10 pigs at 60 meters, 10 turkeys at 77 meters, and 10 rams at 100 meters. A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus sight in rounds.

We shoot with .22 rim fire rifles with scopes or open sights. Any standard velocity or high velocity .22 short, long, or long rifle ammo is permitted but the extra hot rounds such as the STINGER or VIPER rounds and magnums are prohibited.

The following information is taken from the NRA Silhouette Rifle Rule book and explains the match time sequencing:

Time is not checked on each shot but is computed on the indicated allowance for each five-shot string. The Range Officer may terminate any relay before completion of the full time allowance, if all competitors in that relay have completed firing.

Time Allowances:

Ready Time - Fifteen seconds will be allowed after the command **READY** is given before the command **FIRE**.

Two and one half minutes will be allowed to fire one shot on each target of a bank of five targets. Targets are shot in sequential order from left to right.

Alibis - 30 seconds will be allowed for each unfired round of the series in which the alibi is allowed.

Shoot-offs - 30 seconds will be allowed for each shot fired in a shoot off of ties.

A minimum of 30 seconds will be allowed between the command **CEASE FIRE** and **READY**.

The small bore rifle silhouette match is held on the first Sunday of each month.

Setup starts at 8:00am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set up and will start the match promptly at 9:00am.

This event is open to any Zia member/guest and all are welcome. Juniors are encouraged to try this fun and challenging shooting sport.

The adjacent bench rest/plinking range to the immediate West of the Small Bore Rifle Silhouette Range will be closed for the duration of our matches. This will allow us to provide participants with a higher level of safety.

Every effort will be made to publish range closures in the Club Newsletter and on the web site prior to such a match or tournament. The Range Officer in charge of the match shall have the authority to halt firing on any adjacent ranges which he deems unsafe to the competitors or other shooters.
