June 20, 2024 Zia Board of Directors Gathering Notes

The June 20, 2024 BOD meeting was not called to order due to not attaining a quorum of the board with 16/21 members in attendance. Those present discussed some Club-related items as detailed below from 7:01 PM to 7:51 PM at the Bear Canyon Senior Center.

One of the Club's Junior shooters, 13yr old James Tucker came to tell us about his experiences and express his gratitude to the Club for all we have done for our Juniors. He has been to the Jr. Olympics and is heading to Nationals. James was super enthusiastic and very articulate at the meeting.

Sharon explained the May Statement of Activity and circulated Activity budgets to the Activity Chairs.

Nate reported it was a quiet month regarding Legislative Issues we are still monitoring the Special Session preparations.

Gary Wells reported that the indoor range A/C project is complete and working. Final cost of \$11041 came in midway between the initial and expanded allowance.

Ted Simmons plans to start using two berms for Family Rimfire Steel to speed up the matches.

Ted then told us about his experience at a Cowboy Shooting Match in Utah during which a woman shot herself in the foot (big toe). She was a new shooter did not follow proper procedure when drawing from her holster. Lessons learned that may help us include:

- This match/range had no planned medical response (Zia does for organized activities)
- Match management had no first aid (or trauma kits) in the berms or trauma training for the ROs unlike Zia
- 911 asked multiple times if it was a shooting or an accident EMTs arrived plus one police officer to make a report
- Pre-designating a person to be in charge in the event of a medical emergency could save precious time
- Securing all firearms on the range may not be possible depending on the activity and/or range. In this example, firearms were all made safe, but not necessarily secured (berms were not close to parking) and it was not a problem.
- We should be prepared to recommend a hospital (especially important for matches with "out of towners")

The next BOD meeting will be held on July 18, 2024, starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Bear Canyon Senior Center, 4656 Pitt NE.

Starting Tuesday, August 8th, Operating Engineers will begin repairs to heavily damaged roads at Zia. The first project will be the west fork road that leads up to the plinking range and the action pistol berms. Operating Engineers will be using heavy equipment to bring in fill dirt and compact it. We will be looking at opening up new drainage channels to force runoff water to other areas away from the road.

The second phase of the repair project will be to restore the road on the east range that leads straight south to the 600 yard range parallel with the north/south shotgun range. A buried drainage culvert under the road was made up of various concrete and galvanized steel pieces and was never joined properly. The cockeyed culvert filled up with everything imaginable and forced runoff water to flow over and destroy the road downstream. A new, larger diameter culvert will likely be installed in addition to repairing the road.

THIS PROJECT WILL REQUIRE THE CLOSURE OF THE EAST RANGE AT TIMES DURING THE WEEK AS OPERATING ENGINEERS WILL BE WORKING DOWN RANGE OF THE 600 YARD FIRING LINES. CLOSURE SIGNS WILL BE PLACED AT THE FRONT GATE AND ON THE ROAD LEADING TO THE 600 YARD RANGE. THE SHOTGUN RANGE WILL BE OPEN.

Please read all emails from Zia as this project is undertaken so that you do not end up driving to the range and finding the 600 yard range and attached long ranges closed.

If there are any problems with members trying to shoot at the 600 yard range while Operating Engineers are working or have equipment downrange, the entirety of Zia will be closed so that work can be conducted safely. We are relying on the good sense and understanding of our membership to conduct these repairs safely and efficiently - and if this proves to be insufficient, the range will be shut down (and a padlock will appear on the gate!) until downrange work is complete.



And Read This!

Please shoot only at approved targets on ranges. On most ranges, this will mean steel, paper, or clay targets, depending on the range. On the plinking berms, this can be other, nonstandard targets as long as those targets are safe. Regardless of target choice, all rounds should come to rest within the berm.

Throwing rocks downrange and then shooting at them is not a safe target selection, as a ricochet which recently broke a rear car window amply demonstrated. Those shooting were lucky to have not been struck themselves.

“Place your targets as deeply in the berm as possible, at the base of the berm so as to insure that **every round will come to rest within the berm**. Shooting up at targets or down at steep angles can cause the round to pass through the target and out, or to ricochet up and out of the berm. This is an important safety issue. **Do not allow your rounds to leave the berm you are using!!** Repeated violations may lead to dismissal from the club” - *Zia Member Guidebook*

If you see unsafe behavior at the range, please assist the person who is not shooting safely by nicely reminding them of the range rules. In the event that that does not fix the problem, please report the issue to the board immediately - a license plate number will be sufficient if the person does not provide their name. If you are shooting unsafely at Zia, expect to be required to appear and justify your actions to the board to retain your membership.

Let's all work together to stay safe and have fun at the range!

Member Spotlight

Jay Sullivan



Jay Sullivan has been a member at Zia for about 20 years. “I joined Zia after I began shooting rimfire benchrest”, he says. He likes the facilities at Zia, in particular, the tunnel. And what he likes the most is the relaxed atmosphere and camaraderie at Zia.

Jay started shooting when he was about 10, in the early 70’s, and in competition in 2003. “I began shooting .22 rimfire in 2003 and in those days, shot .22 benchrest for group size. I began shooting Schuetzen in 2006 at the ISSA Nationals at the Whittington Center.”

He says he participates in the ARA Rimfire Benchrest and the 600 yard matches at Zia. “I am frequently at the benchrest range shooting my Schuetzen guns, both benchrest and offhand.”

There are a few guns that he likes shooting. “I really enjoy the Schuetzen guns. I use a Ruger #3 chambered for .32 Miller short for the centerfire bench matches. For centerfire offhand, I use either a #1 Ruger or a Hoch, both of which are in .32 miller short. For the rimfire Schuetzen matches, I use a BSA Martini Mk2 off the bench and a Winchester High Wall offhand.”

In the future, Jay would like to see Zia expand and encourage participation in the organized activities. And Jay mostly shoots with the ARA group, “of which I am the match director”, he says.

“H.M. Pope” is who Jay would like to get a shooting lesson from. When asked why, he said “his contribution to rifle accuracy and shooting are unsurpassed.”

And finally, what is something interesting about Jay that is completely unrelated to shooting?

“I did an informal apprenticeship with a watchmaker about 25 years ago and enjoy collecting American pocket watches, particularly keywind watches from the 1860’s to the 1890’s.”

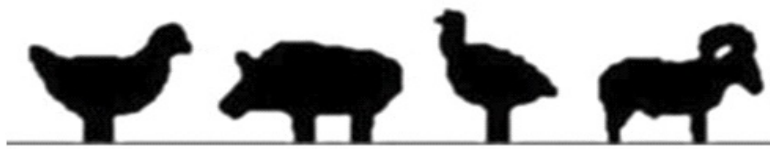

The way you advance to the next level is to shoot 3 subsequent scores within the higher range(s). New shooters will shoot “unclassified” and once a score is recorded, that will be the class in which they will shoot until higher scores move them “up”.

Dave B. shot a 24 to take first place in the 1/5 size target match. And along the way he picked up a 5 in a row pig pin. Way to go Dave.

Small Bore Silhouette shooting is one of the most challenging sports for individual marksmanship. Many great shooting competitions offer challenging shots at long range from a bench or other supported position. All our shooting is done from a standing position swaying in whatever breeze there happens to be. We shoot 10 chickens at 40 yards, 10 pigs at 60 yards, 10 turkeys at 77 yards, and 10 rams at 100 yards. A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus sight in rounds.

We shoot with .22 rim fire rifles with scopes or open sights. Any standard velocity or high velocity .22 short, long, or long rifle ammo is permitted but the extra hot rounds such as the STINGER or VIPER rounds and magnums are prohibited.

The following is information taken from the NRA Silhouette Rifle Rule book and explains the match time sequencing:

Time is not checked on each shot but is computed on the indicated allowance for each five-shot string. The Range Officer may terminate any relay before completion of the full time allowance, if all competitors in that relay have completed firing.

Setup starts at 8:00am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set up and will start the match promptly at 9:00am.

This event is open to any Zia member/guest and all are welcome. Juniors are encouraged to try this fun and challenging shooting sport.

The adjacent bench rest/plinking range to the immediate West of the Small Bore Rifle Silhouette Range will be closed for the duration of our matches. This will allow us to provide participants with a higher level of safety.

The bench rest rifle silhouette (formerly known as "Mouse Gun") match is held on the second Sunday of each month

For those of you that are wondering what we do...

For the Standard long range competition:

We take a scoped .22 rifle that has plenty of elevation adjustment and shoots long rifle ammo (**no stingers or hyper velocity**) and we shoot at 1/5 scale targets, whereas the chickens are set a 60 meters and are roughly 2"x2" in size. The pigs which are roughly 3"x4" are set at 100 meters, the turkeys, roughly 3"x5" tall are set at 150, and the rams 6"x4" are at 200 meters.

Relays consist of 10 chickens at 60 meters, 10 pigs at 100 meters, 10 turkeys at 150 meters, and 10 rams at 200 meters.

For the Xtended long range competition:

We shoot chickens at 150 yds. pigs at 200 yds., turkeys at 290 yds., and rams at 325 yds. The size of these targets are 3/8 scale much bigger than the standard 1/5 scale targets, but further away.

In order to shoot either long range match:

All you need is a sand bag, maybe a bipod, or perhaps a fancy bench rest rig, it doesn't matter as any type of rest is allowed. At the onset of each 15 minute relay, there are unlimited "sighters" at the beginning sighters being shots that are fired at a 8"x11" steel plate set at the same distance at each of the targets. When you are pretty sure that your rifle is sighted in good enough for that bay of targets, the "sighters" stop and you shoot 10 shots in left to right order in what is remaining of the 15 minute time allotment for score. This all done while sitting at a bench. It is a relaxed atmosphere and a ton of fun! A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus "sighters".

Setup starts at 7:30 am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set up if possible, and will start the match promptly at 8:00am.

I encourage anyone with a .22 rifle to come out and give this a try! Most folks that have are now hooked. If you have any questions, please call or text Tom 505-350-4026

Please note, on the 2nd Sunday of each month when this match is held on the East range, the F-Class range and the Precision Tactical range is closed for the duration of this event.
