May 21, 2026 Zia Meeting Minutes

The Zia Rifle and Pistol Club monthly board meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. on April 16, 2026, at Bear Canyon Senior Center, with President Casey Ahner presiding. A quorum of the BOD was achieved with 18 of 22 board members in attendance.

Item I - Approval of Agenda

The meeting Agenda was approved with multiple additions (Heidi Chowning: connex repairs, club phone number, FAA update, master keys, and gate data; Steve Akard: travel assistance for the Haney's).

The April meeting Minutes were approved with the title corrected.

Item II - Treasurer's report

Heidi Chowning presented the Treasurer's Report on behalf of Sharon. Heidi covered the April Statement of Activity the range maintenance item includes the final dirt work payment to Operating Engineers. The Treasurer's report was approved.

Item III Legislative Action Committee Report

Nothing to report.

Item IV - Old Business

Heidi Chowning gave an update on the dirt work the berm protecting the range house is finished. Compacting the Action berms should start soon. Good progress is being made on Action berm 4.

Steve Akard is working the East range improvement/rebuild project. He asked for \$1700 to purchase new steel targets for all members to enjoy. A motion was made to authorize \$1700, seconded, and passed.

Dustin McGlasson presented some plans for wifi coverage on the west range. He will work to refine the proposal and update us at a later meeting.

Heidi informed the board that multiple connexes were repaired. A short discussion on a new Club phone number resulted in a directive for Casey to take care of obtaining a club cell phone and service plan. Finally, we were informed the FAA project completes on the last week in May. A new email blast will be sent out to let members know the east range is fully open on May 30th.

Item V - New Business

Toma Shaver had 3 of our junior shooters come and give a report to the BOD on the State 4H match. The shooters gave their reports and thanked the board for the support, coaching, and place to train.

Heidi started a discussion on Action berm 4. We need to get some new signage (for all the Action berms), the rules will be the same as Action berms 2 and 3.

Javier Chavez discussed the annual meeting venue. The board agreed to have Javier search for and propose a location at a future meeting.

Heidi discussed putting together a master set of keys for the range. Each activity should make a copy of their key(s) and bring them to the June meeting. Heidi also let us know that the gate system has a very limited storage capability which can be upgraded with an internet connection (in work).

Steve Akard proposed that Zia assist the Haneys with expenses for the world shotgun match in Greece. A motion was made to sponsor Ross and Laure with \$1500 each. The motion was seconded and passed.

Item VI - Adjourn

After discussing all the items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 8:11 p.m. The next BOD meeting is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. on June 18, 2026 at the Bear Canyon Senior Center at 4645 Pitt St. NE.

Happenings at Zia!

Did you know our clubhouse, which is an old military barracks, was donated to Zia by Kirtland when the club was formed in 1959? Needless to say, it's weathered a lot over the years, and it's been in need of some attention.

The heating and cooling system was upgraded approximately two years ago and a new roof was installed last year. Next up (in the coming weeks) will be the repair and repainting of the exterior.

These investments will ensure the clubhouse remains in good condition and safe for our juniors for the coming years.

On the east range, target steels are being inspected and repaired and new targets are being added for the enjoyment of all shooters.

The safety berm behind the clubhouse, which protects it from potential errant shots from the east range, has been repaired and extended. Over the years the berm has eroded. We've raised it higher and we've expanded its length. By expanding and raising the berm we've ensured the clubhouse and tunnel range are protected.

We've graded, leveled, and compacted berms 1 through 3 and repaired the height of the side berms. They've gotten rutted and unlevel over the years, and the side berms have eroded, so we've made necessary repairs. Water trucks have been utilized to help compact the berms, however, due to the fact the club sits basically on a sand pile, there is only so much compaction the trucks can do. You may find some small areas within the berms that are a bit soft at the moment. We ask for your patience. Once the berms get baked from the hot summer sun and rained on during our summer monsoons, those soft spots should firm up nicely. In the meantime, please be aware of the soft spots so you don't inadvertently get stuck.

We're also constructing a fourth berm, which is located directly west of the plinking berms. This will be a multi-use berm available to all members. An official notice will be sent when construction is completed and it's officially open. In the meantime, please do not enter that berm.

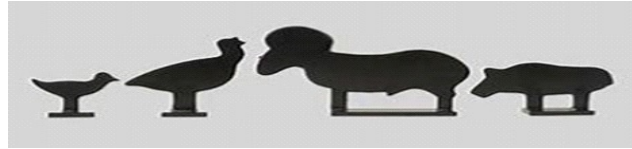

This class structure has no bearing on any classifications or qualifications outside of this specific match. The purpose is to allow everyone a fair chance at competition and provide a structure for advancement. The way you advance to the next level is to shoot 3 subsequent scores within the higher range(s). New shooters will shoot “unclassified” and once a score is recorded, that will be the class in which they will shoot until higher scores move them “up”.

Small Bore Silhouette shooting is one of the most challenging sports for individual marksmanship. Many great shooting competitions offer challenging shots at long range from a bench or other supported position. All our shooting is done from a standing position swaying in whatever breeze there happens to be. We shoot 10 chickens at 40 yards, 10 pigs at 60 yards, 10 turkeys at 77 yards, and 10 rams at 100 yards. A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus sight in rounds.

We shoot with .22 rim fire rifles with scopes or open sights. Any standard velocity or high velocity .22 short, long, or long rifle ammo is permitted but the extra hot rounds such as the STINGER or VIPER rounds and magnums are prohibited.

The following is information taken from the NRA Silhouette Rifle Rule book and explains the match time sequencing:

Time is not checked on each shot but is computed on the indicated allowance for each five-shot string. The Range Officer may terminate any relay before completion of the full-time allowance, if all competitors in that relay have completed firing.

Time Allowances:

Ready Time - Fifteen seconds will be allowed after the command **READY** is given before the command **FIRE**.

Two- and one-half minutes will be allowed to fire one shot on each target of a bank of five targets. Targets are shot in sequential order from left to right.

Alibis - 30 seconds will be allowed for each unfired round of the series in which the alibi is allowed.

Shoot-offs - 30 seconds will be allowed for each shot fired in a shoot off of ties.

A minimum of 30 seconds will be allowed between the commands CEASE FIRE and READY.

The small-bore rifle silhouette match is held on the first Sunday of each month.

Setup starts at 8:00am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set-up and will start the match promptly at 9:00am. This event is open to any Zia member/guest, and all are welcome. Juniors are encouraged to try this fun and challenging shooting sport.

The adjacent bench rest/plinking range to the immediate West of the Small-Bore Rifle Silhouette Range will be closed for the duration of our matches. This will allow us to provide participants with a higher level of safety.

The bench rest rifle silhouette (formerly known as “Mouse Gun”) match is held on the second Sunday of each month.

For those of you that are wondering what we do...

For the Standard long-range competition:

We take a scoped .22 rifle that has plenty of elevation adjustment and shoots long rifle ammo (**no stingers or hyper velocity**) and we shoot at 1/5 scale targets, whereas the chickens are set at 60 meters and are roughly 2”x2” in size. The pigs which are roughly 3”x4” are set at 100 meters, the turkeys, roughly 3”x5” tall are set at 150, and the rams 6”x4” are at 200 meters. Relays consist of 10 chickens at 60 meters, 10 pigs at 100 meters, 10 turkeys at 150 meters, and 10 rams at 200 meters.

For the X-tended long-range competition:

We shoot chickens at 150 yds. pigs at 200 yds., turkeys at 290 yds., and rams at 325 yds. The size of these targets is 3/8 scale much bigger than the standard 1/5 scale targets, but further away.

To shoot either long range match:

All you need is a sandbag, maybe a bipod, or perhaps a fancy bench rest rig, it doesn't matter as any type of rest is allowed. Following a 15 second "ready" each 10-minute relay allows for unlimited "sighters" at the beginning sighters being shots that are fired at a 8"x11" steel plate set at the same distance at each of the targets. When you are pretty sure that your rifle is sighted in good enough for that bay of targets, the "sighters" stop and you shoot 10 shots in left to right order in what is remaining of the 10-minute time allotment for score. This is all done while sitting at a bench. It is a relaxed atmosphere and a ton of fun! A total of 40 rounds is needed for a match plus "sighters".

Economy class for both Standard and X-tended long-range competition:

For those wishing to use American made bulk type ammo at a lesser cost than imported premium ammo. This allows shooters to use less expensive ammo and compete with like-minded competitors.

Open Class for both Standard and X-tended long-range competition:

For those wishing to use premium ammo the Open Class is available. There is no limit to quality, cost or brand of ammo to use.

Setup starts at 7:30 am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set up if possible and will start the match promptly at 8:00am.

I encourage anyone with a .22 rifle to come out and give this a try! Most folks that have are now hooked. If you have any questions, please call or text Tom 505-350-4026

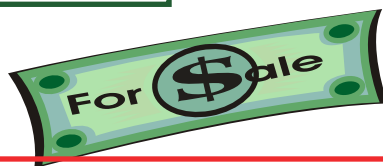
Please note, on the 2nd Sunday of each month when this match is held on the East range, the F-Class range and the Precision Tactical range is closed for the duration of this event.
